NWB Christian Education 29th Annual Unity Day

It has been said that unusual times call for unusual measures. We are thankful to our Lord, Jesus Christ, that He allowed NWB Christian Education to meet the challenges brought on by the coronavirus with their annual Unity Day on February 6, 2021. Unlike previous years, it was not held at the Tabernacle, but through Zoom's webinar platform that was technically guided by Brother Lee Williams of Antioch.

COVID-19 AND VACCINE

The Covid-19 pandemic which has claimed millions of lives worldwide has been one of the scariest and most stressful periods of our time. Since African-Americans are at greater risk for serious illness and death from Covid-19, it is extremely important that we as individuals do everything we can to protect ourselves and our families. As a registered nurse whose daily work focuses on community health, I would like to share several things that we all can do to better protect ourselves against Covid-19.

First, become more knowledgeable about Covid-19 and obtain information from reputable sources such as the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), U.S

Department of Health and Human Services, and National Institutes of Health, just to name a few. Obtaining information from social media may not always be accurate. Covid-19 is defined as a potentially severe, primarily respiratory illness caused by a coronavirus that is characterized by fever, coughing and shortness of breath. It may also cause damage to major organs such as the heart or kidneys. Symptoms include fever, cough, headaches, fatique, muscle aches and loss of smell or taste and usually appear 2 to 14 days after being exposed to the virus.

Secondly, establish a relationship with a doctor if you do not currently have one. It is so important to have a doctor so you can discuss any concerns that you have about Covid-19, treatments and the vaccines. Your doctor will know your medical history and help you to decide if receiving the Covid-19 vaccine is appropriate.

Thirdly, get vaccinated when it is your turn to do so. Covid-19 vaccines teach our immune system how to recognize and fight the virus that causes Covid-19. It takes our bodies about 2 weeks to build immunity against the virus that causes Covid-19 after receiving the second dose of the 2 dose series or 1 dose of the single vaccine series. The current vaccines available for administration in the United States are Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna and Johnson & Johnson's Janssen. Pfizer**BioNTech and Moderna are** mRNA vaccines. They direct the body's cells to make a piece of the virus called a spiked protein that teaches our immune system to make antibodies against the protein. If you encounter the virus later, the antibodies will protect you. Johnson & Johnson's Janssen is a viral vector vaccine. A viral vector vaccine uses a harmless version of a different virus called a "vector" to deliver information to the body that helps protect you. The vaccine teaches your body how to make copies of the spike proteins. If you are exposed to the Covid-19 virus the body will recognize it and fight it off.

Here are a few myths about the Covid-19 vaccines that you may have read along with the correct information.

1. The Covid -19 vaccine can make me sick with Covid-19. NO- the current vaccines that we have for Covid-19 do not contain a live virus that can cause Covid-19 so the vaccine cannot make you sick.

2. After I get my Covid-19 vaccine will I test positive for Covid-19 on a viral test?

No. None of the vaccines currently being administered will make you test positive on a viral test which are given to see if you have a current infection.

3. I don't need a Covid-19 vaccine if I have already had Covid-19 and recovered.

False. Even if you have had Covid-19 and recovered it is recommended that you get a vaccine because experts don't know how long you are protected from getting sick again.

4.Covid-19 will alter my DNA. False. Covid-19 vaccines don't change or interact with our DNA at all.

Finally, continue to wear a mask, practice social distancing (wait 6 feet apart), wash your hands, cover coughs and sneezes, clean and disinfect and monitor your health daily. We all play an important part to keep ourselves safe and protect our family, friends and neighbors during this pandemic.

I strongly encourage each of you to talk with your doctor about getting vaccinated for Covid-19 if you have any questions or concerns.

FEMA COVID-19 FUNERAL ASSISTANCE


Fraud Alert: We have received reports of scammers reaching out to people offering to register them for funeral assistance. FEMA has not sent any such notifications and we do not contact people prior to them registering for assistance.

The COVID-19 pandemic has brought overwhelming grief to many families. At FEMA, our mission is to help people before, during and after disasters. We are dedicated to helping ease some of the financial stress and burden caused by the virus. Under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021 and the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, FEMA will provide financial assistance for COVID-19-related funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020.

FEMA will begin accepting applications for Funeral Assistance on Monday, April 12, 2021 through our dedicated call center. If you had COVID-19 funeral expenses, we encourage you to keep and gather documentation. Types of information should include: (1) an official death certificate that attributes the death directly or indirectly to COVID-19 and shows that the death occurred in the United States, including the U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia, (2) funeral expenses documents (receipts, funeral home contract, etc.) that includes the applicant's name, the deceased person's name, the amount of funeral expenses, and the dates the funeral expenses happened, (3) proof of funds received from other sources specifically for use toward funeral costs. We are not able to duplicate benefits received from burial or funeral insurance, financial assistance received from voluntary agencies, government agencies, or other sources.
