History has been changed time after time because of prayer. It could be altered and changed again if people went to their knees believing in prayer. What a glorious thing it would be if millions of Americans would avail themselves of the greatest privilege this side of heaven - Jesus Christ died to make communion and communication with the Father possible. He told us of the joy in heaven when one sinner turns from sin to God, and in his heart breathes this simple prayer, "God be merciful to me, a sinner."

Today we have learned to harness the power of the atom, but very few of us have learned how to develop fully the power of prayer. We have not yet learned that a man can be more powerful when on his knees than behind the most powerful weapons that can be developed. Part of the song "What a Friend we have in Jesus", frames it this way – "O what peace we often forfeit, O what needless pain we bear, All because we do not carry – Everything to God in prayer!" Have you learned these lessons? Just have a little talk with your Father in heaven, then see how He works it out.



More on Giovonni Nelson

Earlier this year, the Wayne County Board of Education spotlighted Giovonni Nelson, an engineering senior who earned the Park Scholarship, a prestigious scholarship, to attend North Carolina State University.

The Park Scholarship pays expenses for four years of study at North Carolina State
University, and is valued at about \$112,000 for North Carolina residents and \$203,000 for out-of-state residents. The scholarship pays for tuition and fees, room and board, books and supplies, travel, and personal expenses. Park Scholars are also

are given a computer stipend and receive grants to fund professional and personal enrichment experiences, such as research projects, service activities, and conferences in the United States and abroad. Approximately 40 scholarships are given out nationwide each year.

During her high school career, Giovanni has been a NC Coastal Pines Girl Scout. She earned a Silver Award in 2017 and is currently working to earn a Gold Award. She has served as a community volunteer and has served on both the Goldsboro City Mayor's Youth Council and the NC Child Advocacy Council. She is an active member of Vision of Faith Free Will Baptist Church serving as a youth leader and a member of the youth choir and dance team.

It is worth noting in 2012, when Ms. Nelson was in the fourth grade, she received a \$20,000 scholarship to Appalachian State University. During that time, the unique scholarship was awarded annually to a minority WCPS student who earned the highest score on the third grade end-of-grade math assessment.

While Ms. Nelson will not become a mountaineer, she is looking forward to joining the NC State University Wolfpack and plans to major in Biology. Her long term plans are to go to medical school for pediatric oncology.

Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna COVID-19 Vaccines Likely Provide "Vast Majority" of Recipients with Long-Term Immunity, Researchers Say

The New York Times (6/28, Mandavilli) reports a new study published in Nature has found the COVID-19 vaccines from Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna "set off a persistent immune reaction in the body that may protect against the coronavirus for years, scientists reported on Monday."

Researchers gathered samples from the lymph nodes of 14 recruits at five different points following the first dose, finding "the number of memory cells that recognized the coronavirus had not declined" 15 weeks later. The Times adds, "The results suggest that a vast majority of vaccinated people will be protected over the long term."

In a separate article, the New York Times (6/28, Mandavilli, Zimmer, Robbins) says the study adds to other research suggesting that "widely used vaccines will continue to protect people against the coronavirus for long periods, possibly for years, and can be adapted to fortify the immune system still further if needed."

August is Lay Members' Month

August is the month in which churches in the United American Free Will Baptist Denomination, Inc. recognize lay members and select a Lay Member of the Year. This individual is usually selected by church leadership and is awarded with a certificate and the title "Lay Member of the Year".

In the NWB Conference, the local Christian Education Director is responsible for forwarding the name of the Lay Member of the Year to the Annual Christian Education Department for recognition.

The criteria for selecting the Lay Member of the Year include:

- ...Bringing others to Christ and church.
- ...Attending Sunday school, Bible study, prayer meeting, and other meetings called by the pastor on behalf of the church.
- ...Supporting auxiliary programs.
- ...Befriending non-church persons and witnessing.
- ...Attending your church regularly and is accountable to it for its financial obligation as a member in good standing.

Nominations should be in writing. *Exclude officers of the church from nomination.

4 Things You Can Do About Rising Inflation

In June, the Consumer Price Index, which measures the change in the prices of a broad range of goods and services over time, rose 5.4% from a year earlier, marking the sharpest increase in inflation since 2008.1 Whether prices are rising at the gas pump or grocery store, inflation decreases your purchasing power, meaning you pay more money for the same things. While experts debate whether recent increases are a signal that we're entering a period of sustained higher prices—or if inflation will be temporary—there are ways to help manage the impact on your purchasing power.

Why it's different this time

It's important to note that the price hikes we're seeing now are different from those seen at the beginning of the pandemic, which were largely due to shortages and panic buying. In fact, a rise in inflation was expected this year as the economy picked up steam, business restrictions eased, and consumer demand surged. While ongoing supply chain disruptions and pent-up

consumer demand may continue to drive prices upward in the coming months, the Federal Reserve (the Fed), which sets U.S. monetary policy, expects steep rises to be transitory and inflation to remain within its 2% target over the long term, into 2022 and 2023.2 However, there is no guarantee that the Fed will be successful in keeping inflation in check. Conditions could change based on direction of the COVID-19 pandemic, as well as other market, economic, and geopolitical factors. So what can you do to help protect your income from the eroding effects of inflation? Consider the following steps:

Review your budget and spending habits. Cutting back on certain discretionary expenses can free up more money to help pay for essential expenses where prices may be rising for food, healthcare, clothing, or transportation.

Follow a plan. The financial planning process takes inflation and other market and economic factors into account when modeling different strategies and scenarios. Planning can help ensure you have a flexible strategy in place that's aligned with your income and spending goals that can be adjusted as market and economic conditions change over time.

Put excess cash to work. If you have cash on the sidelines that you don't need for current

expenses or to shore up emergency savings, consider investing it, so it can work harder for you.

Check your portfolio asset allocation. A portfolio allocation that's too conservative may not generate the income you need. For example, if your portfolio earned 4% over the course of a year when inflation was at 5.4% for the same period, you could no longer afford the same basket of goods. Consider if it makes sense to allocate a larger percentage of portfolio assets to growth-oriented investments, which can provide a hedge against inflation over the long term.
